

YOU DID IT AGAIN! A MILLION DOLLAR MIRACLE!

It came down to the wire. But when an anonymous donor from Rushsylvania made an \$1,800 online gift on our website on December 30, it lifted pledges to our annual campaign over the \$1 million mark for the third straight year.

The milestone-making gift was symbolic of many generous individual and corporate donations that poured in during the last four weeks of the year.

As late as Thanksgiving, we were projecting a final outcome around \$925,000. We received a record 131 gifts of \$1,000 or more this campaign, including more than 40 during the month of December to help push the campaign over the top. You gave a final total of \$1,014,503 to join our fight for the health,

education, and financial stability of every person in Logan County.

"We are so grateful for each of the 3,030 residents and 141 businesses that stepped up in this unprecedented year to give so generously," said Katie Rychener, who along with her husband Darrin Haubert, Co-Chaired the 2020 Campaign. "Every dollar counted and it came down to the second to last day of 2020 for us to cross the threshold!"

Logan County remains the smallest community in Ohio to ever achieve a \$1 million United Way campaign. It's now happened three years in a row. And it's happened despite the many challenges that 2020 leveled against the community.

HOUSING STABILITY PROGRAM



Rent / utility assistance is the #1 reason why people call 211 for help in Logan County. In a mutual decision with Second Harvest Food Bank, we are bringing this long-funded program in-house this year. More than just a handout, this program will serve as a hand-up for local families in need.

SENIOR PET CARE



LifeCare Alliance, who deliver meals-on-wheels to shut-ins, also has a program to benefit their pets. For many who live alone, pets are their only consistent source of companionship. Meals-on-wheels clients in Logan County can now request financial help to provide pet food, toys, leashes, and veterinary care.

LOGAN COUNTY CANCER SOCIETY

April Pulfer was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2018. Now she's cancer-free! She credits the Care Coordination team at Mary Rutan Hospital, which administers the Logan County Cancer Society, for their support through her family's time of need.

"It gave me somebody to lean on. If I had questions, I could call them and ask. They knew what I was going through. They knew the terminology. Even the little extra support with gasoline? That was tremendous. That really helped. They were able to purchase those extra supplies that you don't even realize you're going to need. And the wig? I assumed that my hair would fall out. But having that person that knew about hair! I don't really know how I would have gotten through it without their support to be honest."

RECOVERY ZONE

Jason Martin showed up at Recovery Zone last year, homeless and desperate.

"I'm not stuck in a bad place any more, severely depressed, alone, and with no one to talk to. I'm working through my problems and becoming a better person. I've found acceptance. No matter what your problems are, no matter what you're going through, there's always somebody to talk to."



TCN NEW DIRECTIONS

Brenda Branch (right) was in a domestic violence relationship and suffered from alcohol dependency when she arrived.

"I wanted to end it. I was at the end of my rope. But now I feel safe. God delivered me from drugs and alcohol. I've got a good support system. Everybody has been really amazing here. There is a better life for everybody. You don't deserve to be abused. I'm no longer a victim. I'm a survivor."

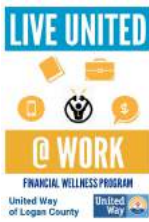

LIVE UNITED @ WORK is a pilot program of United Way of Logan County, working to help stabilize and strengthen the Logan County workforce by providing financial wellness to employees of participating businesses. In partnership with 10 local employers, Quest Federal Credit Union, and the FINRA Foundation, we work to empower employees with information and referral about existing community services to help eliminate barriers that may interfere with work, including the management of personal financial emergencies.

Ashley met with 79 employees throughout our program through February and was on track to meet with over 500 people at your workplaces this year. Then the COVID-related restrictions and shutdowns occurred. As the COVID crisis continues into 2021, Ashley has had to leave some workplaces. We are working on improving the virtual component of Live United @ Work.

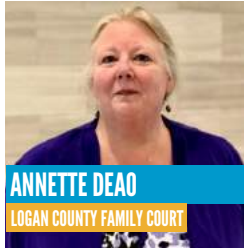

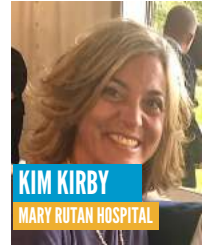
