In Fall 2019, United Way signed on with the Ohio Governor's Imagination Library, an initiative to strengthen existing programs and to extend it statewide. Since then, over \$54,000 in additional dollars has been leveraged at the state level to supplement Logan County support, keeping the program free and accessible without a waiting list.

"We're excited to celebrate more than 100,000 Imagination Library books distributed in Logan County this month with the Ohio Governor's Imagination Library affiliate, United Way of Logan County," said Ohio First Lady Fran DeWine. "This is an incredible milestone, and we are excited to continue seeing the positive impact these books are having on kids in the county, and across the state."

Your generosity helped us bring the country music star's literacy program to Logan County five years ago. Since the first books were mailed in 2017, more than 3,500 children have signed up, with the 100,000th book sent last month.

"All five of our grandchildren were signed up with the Dolly Parton imagination library," said Bellefontaine Mayor Ben Stahler. "They each looked forward to receiving their monthly

Monthly distributions range between 1,700 and 1,800 books. Books are free, but the costs of distribution must be covered by a local provider. Over that time, United Way has invested over \$146,000

NO WEEKENDS OFF! BACKPACK PROGRAM SENDS FOOD HOME WITH RIVERSIDE STUDENTS

Most parents pack lunches for their kids to take to school. But this group packs lunches for kids to take home.

The Greater Riverside Area Community Encouragers stuffs backpacks with meals every Tuesday morning for Riverside students to take home on weekends.

The Pirate Power Pack Program feeds over 100 children every weekend, providing eight meals and snacks that kids can simply open and eat or easily prepare on their own.

"I would like to say "THANK YOU" to all who donate," said Darlene Roll, Co-Chair of the Greater Riverside Area Community Encouragers. "Without your support, this program would not be available to meet the needs in the DeGraff and Quincy areas.

"Your donation makes an impact and you are helping to touch many lives. We don't know the long term effect but we do know that students who have food available to them do better in school. That makes a difference now and potentially later in life."
